**Sunday, July 14<sup>th</sup>** 2 Samuel 6:1-5, 12b-19 or Amos 7:7-15 / Psalm 24 or Psalm 85:8-13 / Ephesians 1:3-14 / Mark 6:14-29 (*written by Sandy*)

Ephesians 1:14 \*this is the pledge of our inheritance toward redemption as God's own people, to the praise of his glory.

## Monday, July 15th Joshua 2:1-14 / Psalm 25 / Romans 11:1-12 / Matthew 25:1-13 (written by Sandy)

Matthew 25:13 "Keep awake therefore, for you know neither the day nor the hour."

Tuesday, July 16th Joshua 2:15-24 / Psalm 26, 28 / Romans 11:13-24 / Matthew 25:14-30 (written by Sandy)

Matthew 25:29 "For to all those who have, more will be given, and they will have an abundance; but from those who have nothing, even what they have will be taken away."

Sloth is one of the 7 "deadly sins". The Bible does not list these all in one passage but were formalized by Pope Gregory 1 around 600 AD. Sloth goes a bit beyond just being lazy because it is also part of being fearful of the "what ifs". The slave that had the one talent knew that his master would reap where he did not sow. The slave was fearful of stepping out to see if he could make a profit for his master. This is like one of us being too fearful to step out and share the love of Christ with others so that our Master can bring more sheep into His fold. The slave that kept the 1 talent was called worthless. Jesus explained by the way of the parable, in verse 30, that such people would be thrown into the outer darkness where there will be weeping and gnashing of teeth. Think about where you want to go after this life.

## Wednesday, July 17th Joshua 3:1-13 / Psalm 38 / Romans 11:25-36 / Matthew 25:31-46 (written by Sandy)

Joshua 3:3,4 "When you see the ark of the covenant of the Lord your God being carried by the Levitical priests, then you shall set out from your place. Follow it, so that you may know the way you should go, for you have not passed this way before."

Have you ever gone somewhere where you didn't have a clue what was going to happen or what you would be doing? Sometimes our daily lives can be like that. The Lord has plans for us throughout the day that we are not aware of. When I joined the Army, almost 50 years ago, I didn't have a faint clue of what I was about to embark on. ## Thursday, July 18th Joshua 3:14-4:7 / Psalm 37:1-18 / Romans 12:1-8 / Matthew 26:1-16 (written by Sandy)

Romans 12:3 For by the grace given to me I say to everyone among you not to think of yourself more highly than you ought to think, but to think with sober judgment, each according to the measure of faith that God has assigned.

Paul was writing to the Romans and advising them not to get a big head or be judgmental toward others. I know sometimes I can be guilty of forming a very quick opinion of someone and learn that I was totally wrong once I take the opportunity to get to know them. We need to look past what a person is wearing or how clean they are. We do not know their situation. Think about the homeless Vietnam Veterans. They came back to being mocked, having stones thrown at them and being spit on. These men and women put their lives on the line so that we can have the freedom to worship God without being in harm's way. In many countries today, people are in grave jeopardy for worshipping God and must do it in secret. But you know what? God is right there with them in the trenches, so to speak. So, next time you see someone on the corner, don't automatically judge them. Hand them some food or a snack or even a bottle of water. For Jesus said something like this: what you do for the least of these, you have done to me.

Friday, July 19th Joshua 4:19-5:1, 10-15 / Psalm 31 / Romans 12:9-21 / Matthew 26:17-25 (written by Sandy)

Matthew 26:24 "The Son of Man goes as it is written of him, but woe to that one by whom the Son of Man is betrayed! It would have been better for that one not to have been born."

Can you imagine? Thirty pieces of silver was about a month's pay in Jesus' time, but we *are* talking about the Son of Man. And then to be told it would be better if you had never been born! Whoa! That is really serious. Judas loved Jesus but his greed got in the way and maybe wanting to be popular tripped him up also. I can also imagine that Judas was probably looking out for his own security. What would you be willing to do to betray Jesus? I hope my answer would be that I would NEVER betray my Lord.
